## **Digging Deeper**

Do you wonder why there's so much God-endorsed killing and nasty stuff in the book of Judges? This is a very significant question and it makes sense to wrestle with this (although, it is interesting to observe that the only answer given by the biblical writers is that the killing is punishment for people's wickedness – e.g. Leviticus 18.24-26; Deuteronomy 9.4-5. To the biblical writers, it seems, this is a sufficient answer).

Weekend – Review the most meaningful passages of the week.

Each day this week you are invited to read the day's passage and then respond to the following questions. Take special note of what God is saying to you. You might find it beneficial to use a journal or notebook to record insights.

- 1. Read the passage prayerfully, listening for the voice of God and asking him to speak to you.
- 2. Record or write down the word, phrase, or verse that God impresses upon you.
- 3. Reflect and write down what it is about this word, phrase or verse that is meaningful to you.
- 4. Respond by writing a prayer or recording what it is that you think the Lord wants you to do in response to his word ("Be doers of the word and not hearers only" James 1:22).
